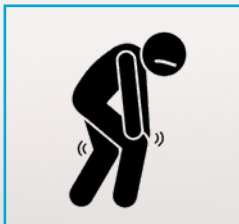

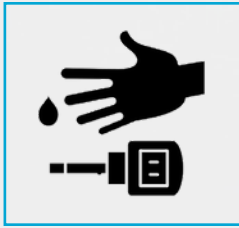


Difficulty walking, holding objects, or maintaining balance.

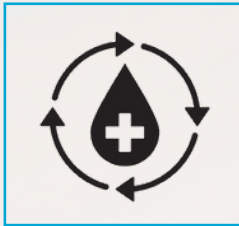
In more severe cases, nerve pain can affect sleep quality, cause constant fatigue, and even lead to mood swings, such as anxiety and irritability.

Neuropathy can have many origins and is often linked to lifestyle habits or chronic health conditions. Among the most common causes, we highlight:



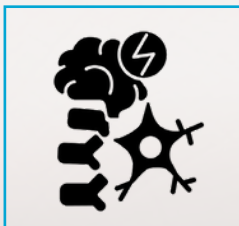
Diabetes: This is the leading cause of neuropathy worldwide. Excess blood sugar damages nerves over time.

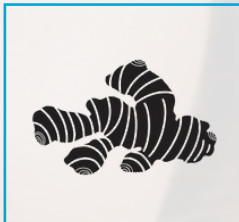

Take **Nerve Zen** daily, preferably at the same time, to maintain consistency and enhance its effects.



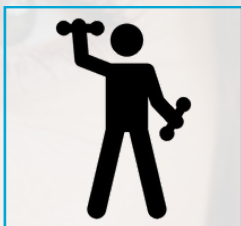
Include light walks of 15 to 20 minutes daily. Moving your body gently helps improve circulation, relieve tension, and provide more energy for the days ahead.

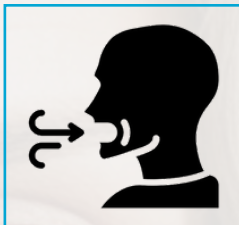


Exercise gently:

Days 7 to 10 – Relaxation, Sleep, and Nerve Regeneration

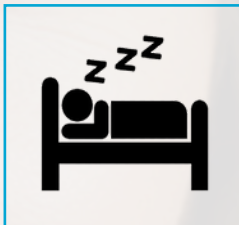

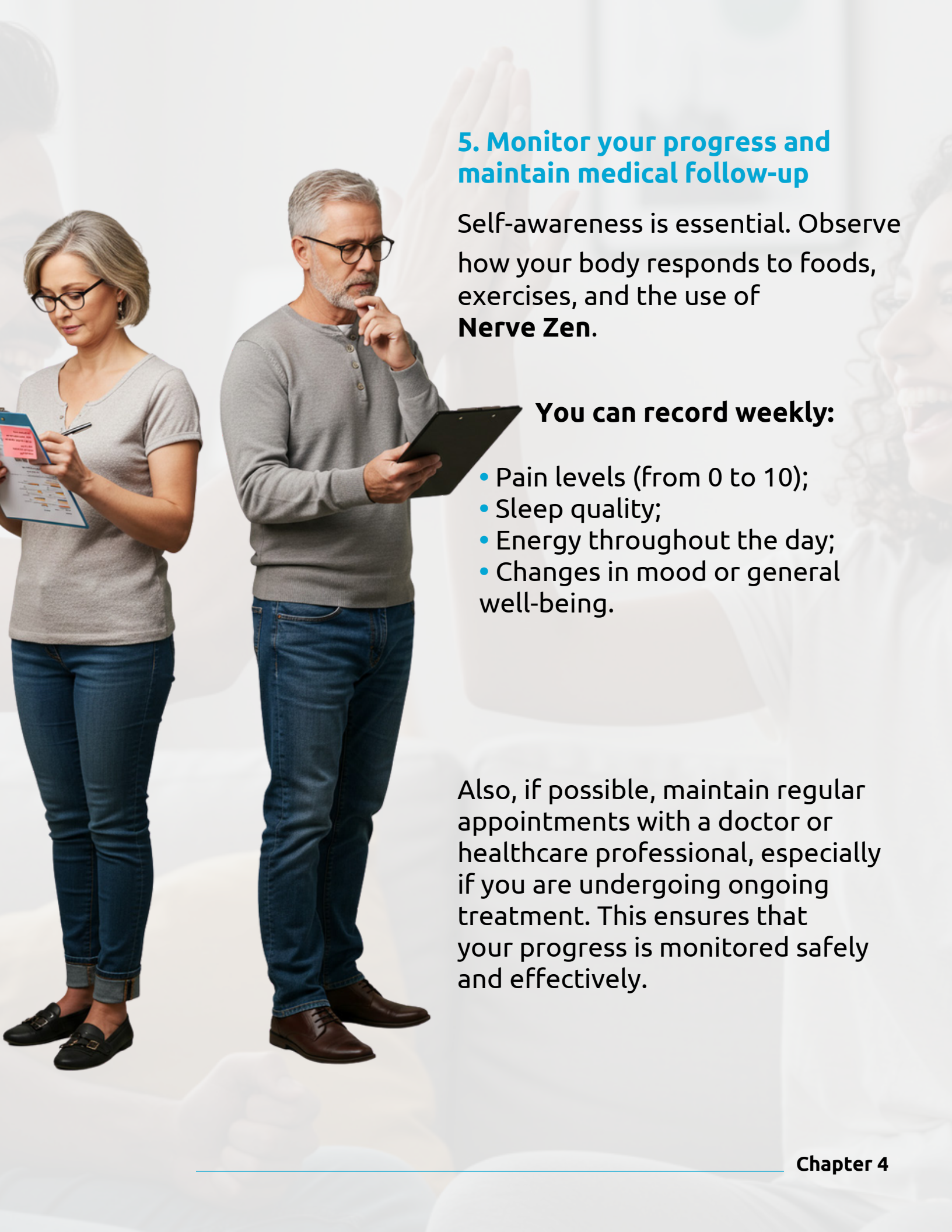
